

ATV MUD BOG RULES

DOT Approved helmet, boots, shirt and long pants must be worn during competition.

Triple S Rodeo & Fair (“the Organization”) race director reserves the right to make rule changes or decisions as they deem fit to promote fairness in the competition. All the decisions by the director are final.

All entrants must register, pay the entrance fee and sign a waiver.

Mud Bog Rules –

Rules may change for the betterment of the event on an as needed basis.

- All entrants must register and sign a waiver in advance releasing the Organization and sponsors from all liabilities. All machines must have valid liability insurance and registration. A parent or guardian who will execute the waver must accompany entrant less than 18 years of age. No one under the age of 16 may participate.
 - Entrants may enter any class that they are not disqualified from entering; this means an entrant can race in their class or in a higher class, the entrant cannot race down a class.
 - In case of ATV sharing the ATV can only be entered in 1 class.
 - The race director will have the final say in which class the entrant may ride.
 - All classes, except for the open class will be determined by the manufacturers label on/for the ATV.
 - Cost is \$20.00 for each class entered, maximum entries is 2.
 - Once registered there will be no refunds, entrance money goes to the Organization•
- Winners will be awarded prizes.
- All ATV’s entered must have a means of attaching a tow rope to the ATV should it

become disabled or stuck during the event. Participants are responsible for attaching the tow rope to their own machine.

All ATV's arriving at the starting line must be ready to race. Work may not be performed on the ATV in the staging area and on the starting line.

- Starting line position will be determined by the Organization race director.
- If a participant commits a false start, the race will be restarted. If the participant commits a second false start, • this participant will be disqualified and the race will be restarted.
- Boundaries of the bog will be marked; participants who partially leave the course with any portion of their machine will be disqualified.
- The winner of each race will be determined by the ATV that makes it through the bog first. If no ATV makes it through the bog the winner will be determined by farthest distance. Distance will be measured from the start line to the front of farthest front Tire.
- At least 1 hand and 1 foot must remain on the ATV at all times during the race. The only time a rider is allowed to dismount the ATV during the race is if the ATV is rolling over, the rider is then allowed to catch the ATV and maintain control. If the rider dismounts and the throttle is pressed they will be disqualified.

Participants are not allowed to consume any alcohol, drugs or any contraband substance prior to or during races. Any participant found under the influence of alcohol or drugs will be immediately disqualified from competition.

- In the event any participant or persons accompanying said participant is observed operating his or her machine in an unsafe or unsportsmanlike manner the participant and entire party accompanying participant will be asked to leave the Organization property. No refunds will be given.
- All participants must attend the drivers meeting before the event begins.

- ATV must be in safe mechanical condition to compete
- Your designated number must be mounted on front of handle bar or front bumper and be secured top & bottom or to be determined by the event directors.
- No Tires for skimming are allowed in any event

The course and details about the run will be announced at the driver's meeting.

Classes & Rules

Stock Class Rules

Max 3" lift

Max 30" tires

Tires must be production ATV tires and size stamped on sidewall

Big bore kits, aftermarket exhaust, intake systems and CDI boxes are fine as long as quad does not exceed engine size for the class you are competing in

No large paddles or tracks

No race fuel

No nitrous

No turbo

Stock Classes

ATV Single Cylinder up to 649 cc

ATV Single Cylinder 650 cc to 750 cc

ATV Twin Cylinder up to 649 cc

ATV Twin Cylinder 650 cc to 849cc

ATV Twin Cylinder 850 cc – 1000 cc

RUV Single Cylinder

RUV Twin Cylinder

Open Class Rules

No large paddles or tracks

Tires must be production ATV tires with size stamped on sidewall

Must be a ATV engine and frame

No wider than 6'6" and no longer than 8'6" ATV and 13'6" RUV

Any machine is permitted to register in a higher class as long as the engine does not exceed the cc of that class.

Depending on the number of entries, the event directors may decide to combine some classes together.
